<u>English</u> This term we will be covering different areas of English:

- Spelling, Punctuation and Grammar
- Folk Stories
- Non-Chronological Reports



Our topic this half term is 'Hunted' and through our literacy lessons we will begin by looking at a collection of folk stories about Brer Rabbit and the tricks he plays on a fox. We will explore the stories looking for links and study the language used. We will then write our own using our own chosen animals. We will then look at non-choronological reports which we will link to our science topic of living things and their habitats. We will look at various reports about animals before creating our own animals and writing a report on them using the features we have learnt about.

<u>Maths</u>

This term we will be focusing on several areas of Maths:

- Written and Mental x, +, and \div
- Lines and Angles
- Statistics
- Time

This half term we continue our focus on multiplication, division, addition and subtraction methods but we will also bring in our knowledge of decimals and fractions as we do this. This half term we will also be looking at statistics - collecting data and presenting it in different ways as well as lines and angles We will then move on to time - learning how to tell the time on analogue and digital clocks and solving time problems

Maths Shed

Please continue to encourage your child to go on Maths Shed regularly to practice their times tables. This is very important as times tables help with all aspects of the maths curriculum.





















<u>Science</u>



In our science lessons, our focus will be on 'living things and their habitats.' We will look at various habitats and the animals that live within them. We will be grouping and classifying the animals into different groups. We will then focus on the food chains within the habitats. We will look at predators and prey and also study different animal's diets.

Key science vocab

Habitat, prey, predator, producer, omnivore, herbivore, carnivore, plants, meat, vertebrates, invertebrate, insects, mammals, reptiles, fish, birds, reptiles

<u>Art</u>



In our art lessons, we will be doing a study on different parts of different animals. We will look at the textures of feathers, fur and scales. Children will then focus on parts of the animal to produce observational drawings before exploring shade and tone through different mediums.


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This half term we will be we will be studying Hinduism focusing on the question 'What qualities make a good leader?'

PE
